## Getting to Know Me Questions:

- What's one of your favorite Christmas carols? What is it about this carol that's so special to you?
- As a kid, what is the one gift you always wanted, but never received?

## Into the Bible Questions:

- What stood out, was interesting or something you learned from the teaching?
- How was your coming to know Christ as your Savior like the dawning of a new day? Each of you give your testimony of faith. Note: It doesn't have to be flashy or look like others. Maybe you are not even sure of your story. Share about your faith walk.
- Read Luke 2:1-21.
- What types of emotions or thoughts do you have when you read about Christ's birth?
- What do you find most inspiring about the way Christ's birth is described in Luke 2?
- Listen to the song "Oh Holy Night" (Side question: Do you have a favorite version? If so which one?) Lyrics are on the back of the page
- Read Lamentations 3:19-26.
- The author says "I remember"; "I call to mind"; "I say to myself". Describe a time where you had to do this for yourself in faith. What was going on? Why did you have to do this?
- Pastor Kirby said that A New Day with Jesus...
- ...brings exactly what we need **Read v. 24** 
  - Part of getting what we need means waiting. Is it a struggle for you to wait for things? What's the difference between waiting and lazy?
- ...brings us the hope to keep going. Read v. 25
  - Read Hebrews 10:23
  - Talk about a time (your emotions, thoughts, actions etc) when everything felt hopeless.
  - What was the final outcome? How did that affect/change you?
- ...brings the help that we're seeking. Read v. 26
  - Help, like miracles, look and can be defined differently for each person and situation. Talk about a time in which you received help – don't need to over spiritualize this – Just a time that you got help that you really needed.
  - $\circ~$  Ok, now, talk about God in this. Did you see God in it? How?
- Where in your life do you feel tired and weary? What has caused your weariness? *Application Questions:*
- What needs do you currently have that you are relying on Christ to provide?
- How can we, as a group, help with those needs? (We are the hands and feet of Jesus)

- Advent Theme: Home For Christmas
- Holy Night (Cantique de Noël)
- "The Weary World Rejoices"
- Question: What does it look like to rejoice in the weariness?
- Rejoicing is not the same as cheerful

#### Luke 2:1

<sup>1</sup> In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world.

- "A thrill of hope the weary world rejoices."
- <u>Translation:</u> "The entire world thrills with hope on this night that gives it a savior."

Lamentations 3:19-20

- <sup>19</sup> I remember my affliction and my wandering, the bitterness and the gall.
- <sup>20</sup> I well remember them, and my soul is downcast within me.

Lamentations 3:21-23
