${ }^{10}$ But the Lord said, "You have been concerned about this plant, though you did not tend it or make it grow. It sprang up overnight and died overnight. ${ }^{11}$ And should I not have concern for the great city of Nineveh, in which there are more than a hundred and twenty thousand people who cannot tell their right hand from their left-and also many animals?"
${ }^{9}$ As Jesus went on from there, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. "Follow me," he told him, and Matthew got up and followed him.
${ }^{10}$ While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and sinners came and ate with him and his disciples. ${ }^{11}$ When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?"
