1. LOVE GOD

LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELFGO DO THOSE TWO THINGS AND YOU WILL HAVE ETERNAL LIFE.

WHO IS MY NEIGHBOR?

Luke 10:30

Jesus replied with a story: "A Jewish man was traveling from Jerusalem down to Jericho, and he was attacked by bandits. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him up, and left him half dead beside the road.

Luke 10:31-32

"By chance a priest came along. But when he saw the man lying there, he crossed to the other side of the road and passed him by. A Temple assistant (A Levite) walked over and looked at him lying there, but he also passed by on the other side.

See the need.

Urban Dictionary defines "awkward" as "when something weird or embarrassing happens, and there's that silence after it. No one really knows what to say ... just back slowly away."

Luke 10:33 "Then a despised Samaritan came along, and when he saw the man, he felt compassion for him.

Have compassion.

Luke 10:33-34 "Then a despised Samaritan came along, and when he saw the man, he felt compassion for him. Going over to him, the Samaritan soothed his wounds with olive oil and wine and bandaged them. Then he put the man on his own donkey and took him to an inn, where he took care of him.

Engage the need.

WHO IS MY NEIGHBOR?

Anybody that God places in your path.

HOW AM I TO LOVE THEM?

See the need. Have compassion. Engage the need.

What good is it, dear brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but don't show it by your actions? Can that kind of faith save anyone? Suppose you see a brother or sister who has no food or clothing, and you say, "Good-bye and have a good day; stay warm and eat well"—but then you don't give that person any food or clothing. What good does that do?

So you see, faith by itself isn't enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless.
